The community page (NAWIC Health & Safety Awareness Committee) has a lot of safety info that is too large to email. Check it out and let us know what you think.

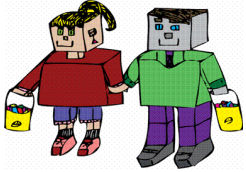

NEF Fundraiser Report

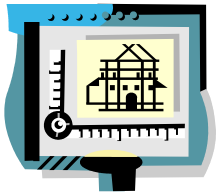

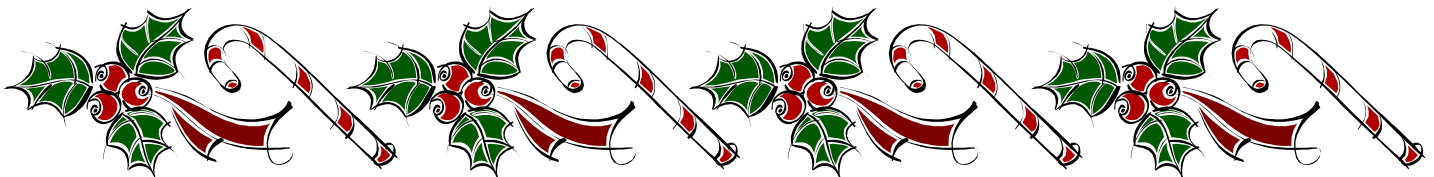
As we head into 2012 it is going to be an exciting year for the San Antonio Chapter as we are planning exhilarating and fun events, such as:
